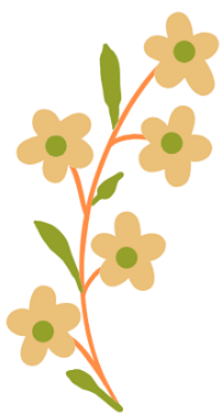


Creating a Bat Habitat

TOP TIPS ON PIMPING OUT YOUR GARDEN FOR BATS



Get planting

Plant night scented flowers to attract bats. Pop in some herbs like lavender or coriander. Primrose, Red Campion and English Bluebells are all great too.

Get off the pesticides

Lay off the pesticides- they kill invertebrates that bats like to eat!



Pop up a box

Pop up a bat box to provide an extra home for bats, whose habitats are diminishing.



Get wild

Natural features are the best features! Let those hedges grow out, leave the grass unmown. Wild gardens are magnets for all kinds of bat attracting insects.



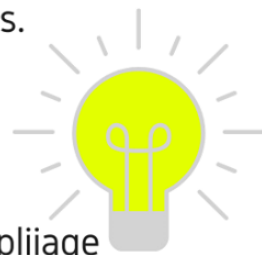
Get hydrated

Create a mini wetland or pond. Any water source will attract insects for bats to eat, as well as drinking water.



Turn off the lights

Bats are light sensitive so think about reducing light spillage into your garden. Create a dark haven for your nocturnal flying friends.



Once you've attracted your bats, pull up a chair and start watching the magic!
